Policy Focus for January:

The Legislature's Responsibility for Children and Youth in Foster Care

As of October 1, 2024, there were approximately 41,000 children and youth in foster care in California between the ages of 0 to 21. Robust policies and programs that prevent abuse and neglect and keep children and youth safe with their families whenever possible are critically important. However, when children and youth are removed from their homes due to maltreatment, the State assumes a moral and legal obligation for their well-being. Therefore, it is vital to ensure that children and youth can remain with their families whenever possible, are raised in nurturing and safe family homes when they must be removed, and children and youth in care have access to the supports and services they need to be healthy, succeed in school, and become thriving adults long after their experiences in the foster care system. The January Child Welfare Policy Roundtable will take a closer look at the legislature's responsibility to children and youth, including the importance of providing family support and engagement, nurturing homes, trauma-informed health and healing, and transition supports to youth as well as ensuring their rights are respected.
